Dragon – Providing the IT User with a Voice

Dragon is a very powerful app that will take what you say and quickly and accurately convert it into text!

This will make it so much easier to write for many people who might find this difficult because they are dyslexic, or perhaps have painful conditions such as arthritis or RSI and so find it painful to use the computer mouse or keyboard.

Imagine being able to dictate your text instead of typing it! This can easily be done at speeds of 120 words a minute or more, up to three times faster than the average typing speed in the UK!

What's in the Dragon Box?

Just the software, although you can also download this if preferred.

You may also need a microphone, which could be USB, Bluetooth, a desktop mic, or the built in mic on a laptop...

Can Dragon really help if you are dyslexic?

We are often asked what happens when Dragon makes a spelling mistake, but this will never happen because every word in Dragon's extensive vocabulary is spelt correctly!

People also say that they may struggle to write when presented with a blank Microsoft Word document but that they could talk about what they want to write...

This therefore means that you can talk instead of typing and ask Dragon to 'write' for you - greatly improving the quality and speed of your writing!

Is Dragon Any Good?

Dragon is a very clever app that 'learns' how you write! If we look back a few years, a Dragon user would need to enrol after installing the

software. This involved reading a set piece of text that helped Dragon to understand how a user spoke – **this is more difficult if you struggle to read!**

There was a choice of texts to read from, one of which was taken from Alice in Wonderland... early Dragon users and trainers could probably recite this word for word!

Dragon today is so much better. The text you read is just to configure the microphone and ensure that the sound quality is good. This usually only takes 20 to 30 seconds.

Once this is done you can start dictating, but there are some key things to be aware of that will make this amazing software even better, **allowing you to write at speeds of 120 words a minute, or more!**

Although Dragon has an extensive vocabulary, it cannot know every word or name and one important tip is to

introduce these words, so for instance, if you are a biochemist and often write about 'enterobacteriaceae', you can easily get Dragon to write this every time you say it. **This is also so much quicker than typing it!**

Dragon and Dyslexia

Many people we train will tell us that sitting at a computer screen with a blank document and a keyboard is difficult. If this sounds familiar, then Dragon could be the answer!

Professional people also tell us that when typing, that they may use simpler words because they are easier to spell – this can make their work look less professional. **Dragon will help with these problems!**

Not only does it save time, but Dragon also significantly reduces the errors that you might make when typing because it cannot make a spelling mistake! However, although very accurate, proof reading is still important.

Dragon and Arthritis, RSI and Carpal Tunnel Syndrome

These conditions can be extremely painful and often develop over a long period of time when people use a mouse or keyboard at work or home, especially if the main task is repetitive. This often means that work takes longer because regular breaks are needed, and we often see people working longer to catch up.

An ergonomic assessment can help by suggesting an alternative mouse or keyboard, and these are important because the body is not naturally designed to use these, and it is often in the small muscles around the fingers that this type of problem can begin.

Using Dragon will help to reduce or eliminate the use of the mouse and keyboard, and with the ability to create custom commands, it is possible to automate repetitive actions.

So, yes, Dragon provides an alternative way of working that will allow people to carry on using their computer without exacerbating their painful symptoms. Not only that, but it is also faster than using the keyboard! Dragon will also help people with Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, ME, and Parkinson's, which might mean that typing is not only painful, but slow.

Transcription – A Lesser Known Dragon Feature

Dictating Remotely

If you are working away from your computer and need to take some notes or write more extensively, you could use a digital recorder such as the Olympus DM-770, or even your phone to dictate your text exactly as if you were using Dragon.

When you return to your computer you can then copy that recording across and use the transcription feature on the DragonBar to transcribe this recording to text.

You will be less likely to want to dictate punctuation such as 'comma' or 'full stop' when doing this, so you could also a use a feature where Dragon does this for you. This can also be very helpful if you struggle to get punctuation correct in your text!

Another great feature here is to ask Dragon to transcribe someone else's voice! This could be useful for podcasts or lectures if it is a single voice, but you do have to be careful with the recording quality.

Sadly, Dragon cannot accurately transcribe conversations yet, but this is probably on the way!

One of our favourite sentences as dictated on one of our courses!

"The results depend on considering the reversible conversion between the D cord chloroplasts decarbamylated and carbamylated states." No, we don't know what it means either, but it was so easy to set up so that Dragon wrote it as quickly as we spoke it!
